

# National Water Hygiene Scheme

## Overview

Water companies require the course for people who need access to potable water sites and installations. The aim of the course is to provide an understanding of the need for good hygiene, when working with potable water. It outlines the methods for prevention of contamination of potable water supplies.

The scheme is a national scheme operated by Energy and Utility Skills. Following successful completion of the course the individual will receive a National Water Hygiene Card, which will allow them to work on restricted operations.
